







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






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










7) To what extent does the course study enable the student to acquire job/work related knowledge and employability skills?














As can be seen from the above pie charts, majority of the teachers felt that the CBCS curriculum facilitated acquisition of knowledge and it gave scope to the students to develop their skills, personality and creativity. Almost three-fourth majority of the staff felt that the curriculum has practical ability to only some extent. Most of the teachers also felt that the CBCS curriculum to some extent enabled the students to use computing skills and information technology in the class.
